

**Information for Attendees of the
American Law and Economics Association's
Sixteenth Annual Meeting
May 5-6, 2006
University of California, Berkeley**

Dear Meeting Attendee:

Below is some important logistical information about our Annual Meeting, as well as information about our on-line Authors' Bazaar, etc.

- 1) **LOCATION OF SESSIONS:** Please note that all conference sessions will be held at **the Clark Kerr Center, which is located at 2601 Waring Street in Berkeley.** The Center is a very short walk from the Claremont, Durant, and Bancroft hotels. We will arrange to have maps and directions at the Bancroft, Durant, and Claremont hotels.
- 2) **PARKING:** For those who prefer to drive to the Clark Kerr Center, parking is available at a cost of \$10.00 for Friday and \$7.00 on Saturday. Because there are a limited number of spaces, you may find it easier to walk over to the Center, particularly if you plan on arriving at the Center later in the day. The Center is less than 1/2 mile from each of the three hotels listed above.
- 3) **COCKTAIL AND DINNER RECEPTION:** On Friday evening, there will be a cocktail party and dinner at the Berkeley Faculty Club, which is located on campus. It is a short walk from the Conference Center. However, for this wishing to ride, we will be providing shuttle service to the Faculty Club following the last conference session. The shuttle will return to the Claremont hotel after dinner. - 4) **SATURDAY RECEPTION:** A reception will be held on Saturday afternoon, following the last session, at the home of Dan and Gail Rubinfeld, which is located at 44 El Camino Real in Berkeley. The Rubinfeld's home is a short walk from the Conference Center. For those wishing to ride, shuttle service will be provided from the Center to the Rubinfeld's, and then back to the area hotels at the end of the reception.
- 4) **AUTHORS' BAZAAR:** For those of you who have attended prior ALEA meetings, you may remember that we now have an on-line Authors' Bazaar. For those of you who are new to the Association, the Authors' Bazaar is an excellent way for attendees of the meeting who are not presenting a paper at one of the formal sessions (and for those who are as well) to showcase some of their own work, not just to other

conference attendees, but to the general ALEA membership. Attendees of the Annual Meeting are offered an opportunity to post up to three papers in our on-line Bazaar, for viewing and downloading by visitors to our site. To post your papers in our on-line Bazaar, please go to <http://law.bepress.com/alea/> and click on the link on the top of the screen, "Submit a Paper."

Although it is not necessary, you may also bring hard-copies of your paper(s) for the Bazaar with you to the meeting, where we will display them for participants to peruse during the breaks, lunches, etc. As a guideline, we suggest bringing up to 100 copies of each abstract and/or up to 25 copies of each paper. Note that, unfortunately, we will not be able to photocopy papers on site for meeting attendees, so if you do plan to display hard copies of your papers, you'll need to bring the copies with you to the meeting.

5) **FOR PAPER PRESENTERS:** For those of you who are scheduled to present a paper at the meeting, please remember to upload your completed paper as soon as possible. It is in your best interest to post your paper on our site prior to the meeting, so that attendees will have a chance to review your paper prior in advance, which should make for a more lively discussion and more comments at the session itself. To upload your paper, please go to <http://law.bepress.com/alea/> and click on the link at the top of the screen, "Submit a Paper." (This is also the link you would use to post a paper for the Authors' Bazaar. There is no need to distinguish whether the paper you're submitting is a presentation paper or a paper for the Bazaar, as the Editors will assign it to the appropriate area.)
